An exceptional land, therefore, for great international events, for culture and for sports. Sitting between sea and mountain, the "niçois"





TERMS OF PARTICIPATION

• ONLY PLAYERS WHO ARE REGISTERED IN THE DISCIPLINE OF KARATE can take part in this competition and they must be over the minimum age to participate in the EMG by 1st January 2015. Each participant must have a medical certificate attesting to their ability to participate in karate competitions. Participants represents themselves and not their country. A national federation of karate license is obligatory.

SCHEDULE

• **EVENTS WILL TAKE PLACE** Thursday 1st and Friday 2nd October

CHANGE OF CATEGORY

• THE AGE CATEGORIES may be adapted according to the number of participants





DRAWING LOTS

- LOTS WILL BE DRAWN BEFORE THE TE-CHNICAL MEETING. It will be carried out by the organising committee of the event (the international technical delegate and those in change of the event)
- THE RUNNING OF THE COMPETITION will conform with regulations laid out by the World Judo Federation

WEIGH IN

- THE WEIGH IN WILL BE CONTROLLED by the head of the event using calibrated scales
- THE COMPETITOR MUST WEIGH LESS OR EQUAL to the category in which they registered and a higher weight than the category below the one which they registered in "
- IN BORDERLINE CASES COMPETITORS can be weighed in underwear"
- NO WEIGHT TOLERANCE will be permitted

 A WARM UP ROOM WITH BE OPEN TO PLAYERS the day of the competition

TECHNICAL MEETING

• A TECHNICAL MEETING WILL TAKE
PLACE the night before the first match of

TECHNICAL REGULATIONS

REQUIRED CLOTHING

- WHITE KARATE UNIFORM
- RFD OR BI UF BFIT
- RED OR BLUE GLOVES
- MOUTH GUAR

- RED FOOT GUARD AND BLUE SHIN GUARD
- CHEST PROTECTOR FOR FEMALE COMPETITORS
- BOX/CUP FOR MALE COMPETITORS

TERMS OF COMPETITION PROCEEDINGS

• **COMBAT:** By direct elimination with repechage for 3rd place

LENGTH OF COMBAT

- MEN: 2 minutes
- WOMEN: 2 minutes
- **KATA:** by direct elimination with repechage for 3rd place
- COMPETITORS MUST CARRY OUT A DIFFERENT KATA at each elimination round like in repechage. A kata can only be performed one time except if the elimination rounds exceed 5 stages. From the 6th round, just as for the podium places, the competitor can repeat a Kata.
- DECISION IS TOOK WITH THE FLAGS

BEHAVIOUR

- **COMPETITORS WILL NOT HAVE ACCESS** to competition zones before their fight. It is the responsibility of the committee to inform competitors in the warm up zones who has been called to fight and when their fight has been announced.
- WHEN COMPETITORS enter the competition zone they must be wearing the required clothing. They may not bring a sports bag or bottles of water





TECHNICAL REGULATIONS

COMPETITION SURFACES

1. THE COMPETITION ZONE MUST BE FLAT AND DANGER FREE

- THE COMPETITION ZONE MUST
 BE A SQUARE 8X8 M (measured from
 the outside). An extra metre will be set out
 on each side as a 'safety zone'. This 10x10
 will be tatami. The saftey zone of the competition zone must be clearly marked out. The
 zone can be elevated to a maximum of 1m
 above floor level. The raised platform must
 measure a minimum of 12m per side in
 order to include the competition zone as well
 as 2m of safety zone on each side.
- 3 JUDGES WILL BE SEATED AT THE BOUNDARY of the safety zone

EXPLANATIONS

- ALL SIGNS, PUBLICITY BOARDs etc must be at least 1m away from the safety zone parametre
- THE TATAMI FLOORING cannot be slippery against the flooring and have friction against the surface below. It is up to the umpire to ensure the tatami stays in the correct position during the competition





FAIR PLAY AND DISCIPLINE



DISCIPLINE

- THE HEAD FEDERAL UMPIRE will ensure correct proceedings with help from designated umpires. One member of the umpire team can help with the drawing of lots. Any misconduct towards the umpires during the competition will be noted in an official report and given to the national technical director who will deal directly with anyone deemed to have behaved inappropriately. This can include any managers or teachers as well as parents or family members.
- IF THE JUDGE DEEMS IT'S A NECESSITY, the technical director can request a meeting with the disciplinary committee.
- IN ANY CASE, PENALTIES FOR MISBEHA-VIOUR may include sanctions for the person involved or indeed the club which the person represents. This may involve a temporary or definitive ban from competing in federal competitions

UMPIRES

- **FOR EACH FIGHT** the umpire time will be composed of one referee and 4 judges
- THE COMPETITION TABLE will be made up of one time-keeper, an announcer, an arbitrator and a marker

PROTOCOL

- FOR THE BOWING AT THE BEGINNING of each fight, the umpire will stand at the exterior of the competition zone. Two judges will be on the right side and two judges on the left side.
- WHEN THE JUDGES CHANGE, the entering judge will join the exiting judge, they will bow to each other them change position

AWARD CEREMONY AND MEDICAL



THE CEREMONY

• THE OFFICIAL CEREMONIES for each category and each event will take place at the end of the competition at the Athletes Village in a venue set up for this purpose or directly at the competition venue

MEDALS

MEDALS BY CATEGORY: For each category, 4 athletes will be awarded medals (Gold, Silver, Bronze x2). In the event of certain categories being grouped together, each category will award 4 medals

MEDICAL EXAMS

- HEALTH CARE COVERAGE DURING THE EUROPEAN MASTERS GAMES NICE 2015, will be arranged by the Games executive committee in accordance with the specifications of the International Masters Games Association. It will come into effect from 1st to 11th October after being approved by the Alpes-Maritimes administrative centre.
- THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE IS
 RESPONSIBLE for medical devices at the venues and the Athletes Village, the participants, the referees, the judges, the volunteers and the spectators. They will provide a high-quality, efficient and well-organized health service which respects the high standards enforced in France.


ANTI-DOPING CONTROLS

- THE INTERNATIONAL MASTERS GAMES ASSOCIATION has put the executive committee in charge of enforcing anti-doping rules and setting up anti-doping inspections.
- ANTI-DOPING INSPECTIONS WILL TAKE PLACE in compliance with advice given by the International Masters Games Association taken from the World Anti-Doping Code.
- IT IS THE RESPONSIBILITY OF THE ATHLETES and others involved in the events to be aware of the anti-doping regulations and the rules regarding the substances and methods which are banned.


DIRECT ELIMINATION WITH SECOND CHANCE
